How to submit the 2021 Inspection Form, for inspectors and administrators

Introduction

This document is an overview of the PDF uploader which is used for submitting inspections to www.atfsdatabase.org.

This new PDF form has the capability of being printed for handwritten submissions or being typed into for easy emailing and an email upload process. Because the information typed within this form can be imported into the database, it must be filled out correctly or the database will reject it.

Handwritten or Hard Copy Method

Any forms that have been printed out and submitted in hard copy must be entered manually in to the database. This can be done either by the inspector or the state committee database lead. This is the most time consuming and error prone method of data entry as it relies on accurate interpretation of forester data.

This method does not require that the inspector be assigned to the property formally in the database ahead of time. All inspection types supported.

PDF Upload Method (Recommended)

Benefits of uploading directly into ATFS:

- 1. The inspector can type directly into PDF file, a process that is already familiar.
- 2. PDF can be emailed around easily to all parties
- 3. Reduce time between inspection and entry in an easy familiar manner.
- 4. Less chance of human error from copying over manually.

Caveats of upload method:

- 1. All required information must be filled correctly or an error message will be produced.
- 2. Inspection must be assigned in database ahead of time.
- 3. Inspector needs to have adobe reader to fill. Other programs may lock the form and won't allow upload.
- 4. Error messages are returned via email which may get caught in spam folder or lost in cyberspace.

Completed forms should be sent to <u>inspectors@forestfoundation.org</u> with the subject line 'Upload021'. If there are any errors, an email error message will be sent to the sender.

This method requires that an inspector be assigned formally in the database prior to the inspection occurring. All inspection types supported. Once the inspector is assigned within the database, a pre-populated form can be emailed to him/her. Pre-populated forms are only available for landowners and properties that exist the database and that is where the information is pulled from.

Required Fields of the 021 Form

Below is an example 021 form. Some fields and sections are always required while others are only required if a certain answer choice is made.

<u>Red Highlighted</u> fields/sections mean that are **always required** in order to be accepted **from an inspector**. Ex) location of management plan is always required to be filled.

Yellow Highlight indicates that this field is required under certain circumstances. Ex) Landowner signature is required for initial inspections.

Blue Highlighted fields are not required but inspectors are highly encouraged to include this information.
